But managing a testbed is a complex task.

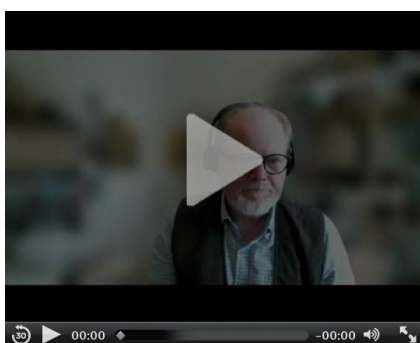
